UNIFORM POLICY



Marist College students are expected to wear their uniform in a way that reflects pride in the College and their own appearance. The College uniform should be neat, clean and complete.

Boys Formal Uniform

Shorts: Grey shorts, worn with plain black leather belt

Shirt: Years 7 – 9: White striped Marist shirt, worn tucked in

Years 10 – 12: White striped Marist shirt with maroon sleeve and pocket trim, worn tucked in

Tie: Marist tie is to be worn in Terms 2 and 3 and at special formal occasions

Socks: Marist formal socks

Footwear: Black, leather lace up shoes

Headwear: Grey Marist hat with band

Jumper: Marist V-neck jumper

Trousers: Grey long trousers, worn with plain black leather belt, can be worn in the cooler months



Girls Formal Uniform

Skirt: Marist skirt, worn below the knee

Blouse: Years 7 – 9: Lemon coloured Marist button up blouse

Years 10 – 12: Years 10 – 12: Lemon coloured Marist button up blouse with tartan sleeve and collar trim

Tie: Years 7 – 9: Crossover tie

Years 10 – 12: Long tie

Socks: Plain white socks

Footwear: Black, leather lace up shoes

Headwear: Cream Marist hat with band

Jumper: Marist V-neck jumper

Stockings: Plain black or skin-coloured stockings can be worn under the formal skirt in the cooler months



Unisex Sport Uniform

Shorts: Blue Marist sports shorts

Shirt: Maroon Marist sports polo

Socks: Plain white socks

Footwear: Lace up joggers. No Volleys, canvas or slip-on shoes

Headwear: Blue Marist sports cap or bucket hat

Tracksuit: Marist tracksuit can be worn in the cooler months



Points to Note

The formal uniform is to be worn on all school days except Wednesdays where the full sports uniform is permitted to be worn. The formal uniform is also to be worn at all special college events such as Academic Awards Night, Opening College Mass and Graduation Day. Uniform must be clean, neat and in good order.

Headwear

Students are required to wear the appropriate College cap/hat when moving around the school, during recess breaks and for all outdoor activities.

Hair

Marist College students are expected to wear their uniform in a way that reflects pride in the College and their own appearance. Hair styles should be appropriate to this image and more 'eccentric/extreme' styles are not acceptable. Hair should be clean, brushed and generally neat. As a guide, the following hair cuts/styles are not permitted: dreadlocks, cuts with marked contrasts in lengths, mullets, undercuts, blade 1s, tracks, wedge cuts, layers, variations to natural hair colours (this includes excessive bleaching). Boys' hair is to be neat and clean, off the collar and out of the face, of a natural colour, of even grade and all extreme styles avoided. Boys are also to be clean shaven at all times. Girls' hair is to be neat and clean, of natural colour and all extreme styles avoided. Hair of collar length or more needs to be tied back and out of the face. Hair bands and accessories need to be modest and kept to a minimum.

Makeup

Makeup is discouraged. Nail polish is not permitted. No false nails, including acrylic, shellac or gel finishes.





Jewellery

Boys: No earrings, spacers or studs are permitted. These will be confiscated. Chains and necklaces should not be visible outside of the uniform except for a small cross on a chain. Badges, apart from School sanctioned badges, are not to be worn. Bracelets, anklets and rings are not permitted. Visible nose rings and non-ear piercings are not permitted.

Girls: A maximum of two pairs of small earrings or studs are permitted in the lobe only. Earrings may only be studs or sleepers. No dangling earrings or large studs. Excesses will result in confiscation. Chains and necklaces should not be visible outside of the uniform except for a small cross on a chain. Badges, apart from School sanctioned badges, are not to be worn. Bracelets and anklets are not permitted. Girls are permitted no more than two rings. Visible nose rings and non-ear piercings are not permitted. This includes clear nose retainers.

Tattoos

Tattoos are not to be visible at any time. They are to be covered at all times when wearing the school uniform and at all school activities.
